LB and ME received a wide range of quotes from people welcoming or commenting on the Strategy from a variety of backgrounds and organisations and were fortunate to have obtained more LB to circulate the quotes than needed. There was a general discussion of the types of images to be used.

WORKSHOP

The meeting broke into breakout groups for the workshop to look at the delivery plan. Following the way in which the strategic aims were divided for the consultation version, RHJ suggested the groups as:

- Aim 1 SD and MH (with RS)
- Aim 2 SG and PH
- Aim 3 RM and CB, SS
- Aim 4 MR, SK, AL and EM
- Aim 5 RT and KM (with MH)
- RHJ will float between the groups

Feedback and discussion:

Aim 2: SG and PH proposed getting rid of the Research group. They have summarised the aim to nine activities. Felt there is a need to promote and encourage good practice, and existing frameworks in archaeology. AL suggested that we may need to come up with a framework to manage a research framework. CB advised that we need to work out a reporting mechanism too.

Aim 3: Initial thoughts were that the 'we will' section from the consultation version was woolly. Suggested an audit. The Strategy gives a firm basis for research and advocacy. The longer term aim would to discuss why some areas are lacking expert advice and others are not. KM asked if there was any thought given to small finds, though this is linked in another strategic aim. It was felt there were enough vehicles out there to enable people to participate without having to think up any more. SHED Strategy being pursued through its own programme board. Involvement of Museums and Galleries Scotland would be important.

Aim 4: Year of Archaeology 2017 – the success of Diglt2015 was noted and the continuation of this into 2017. It was suggested that best practice guidelines from successful projects be promoted. Proposed setting up an archaeology and learning working group, with an online portal for learning resources. KM advised that interrogation board at sites do not usually have enough to make it more accessible to children and visually impaired people. MR advised the Strategy is only mentioned once in the HES corporate plan, on the back page.

MR to type up the notes on aim 4.

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Aim 5: Discussion fell into four different groups, followed by a general discussion on bringing in private sector money to fund / sponsor courses. Examples given were the Scottish Energysponsored Master in engineering, and the college founded by the HS2 company. Aim 1: It was suggested that SSAC consider a discussion with the RSE (potentially Prof I Ralston) about their treasure trove report. It was suggested that students doing dissertations could be encouraged to help finish and deliver backlog projects. Funding / bursaries for this may be able to come from a variety of sources. A potentially ring-fenced fund for international projects was suggested. A general discussion took place on accreditation and how it could help alleviate the backlog problem. **Priorities:** The Archaeology Programme has a small amount of funding for Strategy delivery in 2016-17 which could help 2017 as a standing item push forward some of the priorities from April. The prioritisation on the agenda for next of events in 2017 was highlighted - this will give the strategy couple of meetings something to piggyback on and greater visibility. SD advised that the Committee work out what to focus on. Awards for excellence was suggested; need for skills audit because of the potential loss of archaeologists to HS2.
